YOUR GIFT ENRICHES CHRISTIANITY AROUND THE WORLD

Growing up in a Christian family in 1980s China made Cangfu Wang an outsider. As a child, he struggled to be accepted. "I gradually realized," he said, "that school education merely provided me with a lens but not the lens. I was at peace with my faith."

Years later, Cangfu-now a United Methodist pastor-received a World Communion International Scholarship, supported by generous gifts on World Communion Sunday.

"The United Methodist Church has supported my studies for many years," he said. Cangfu, who is pursuing a doctoral degree in religion, ethics and society at Claremont (California) School of Theology, added, "The scholarship released my burden. I could focus on my studies for my preparation to be a scholar in the future."


Cangfu's goal is to become a seminary professor in his homeland. "Chinese Christianity," he said, "has undergone a revitalization. The number of Christians has increased more than 20 million in three decades. Thousands of churches-forced to shut down during the Cultural Revolution in the 1970s-have been reopened and established."

One of United Methodism's six churchwide special Sundays with offerings, World Communion Sunday is celebrated on the first Sunday of October. Half of the offering benefits World Communion Scholarships: the remainder assists Ethnic Scholarships and Ethnic In-Service Training. "Without such support," Cangfu said, "my studies at Claremont would be impossible."

All items for publication in the weekly bulletin need to be on the secretary's desk or in her email no later than NOON on Wednesday's.


**NEWSLETTER ITEMS:

The office preference is to receive special projects on Monday or Tuesday as those are the "less" busy days. Please allow 3 business days for completion.



5 Facts about John Wesley and United Methodism - Part 1

JOHN WESLEY WROTE ONE OF THE ALL-TIME BESTSELLING MEDICAL TEXTS.

Wesley was deeply convicted that God is concerned about our earthly life as well as our heavenly one. To that end, he wrote a medical text for the everyday person titled *Primitive Physick*. The book detailed the current knowledge about home remedies and went through 32 editions, making it one of the most widely read books in England.

JOHN WESLEY COINED THE TERM "AGREE TO DISAGREE."

Over the years, Wesley had serious theological differences with another popular pastor named George Whitefield. Though they both argued passionately, Wesley reflected on these differences in a memorial sermon for Whitefield by saying: "There are many doctrines of a less essential nature. ... In these, we may think and let think; we may 'agree to disagree.' But, meantime, let us hold fast the essentials. "This appears to be the first recorded use of the term. It was a hallmark of Wesley's way of holding to his convictions while remaining in connection with those with whom he disagreed.

JOHN WESLEY RODE FAR ENOUGH ON HORSEBACK TO CIRCLE THE EARTH 10 TIMES.

Wesley rode 250,000 miles! He was convinced that it was important for him personally to spread the gospel through relationships and continue to grow closer to God in those relationships. Asked if he would consider walking instead of riding, he replied, "Nay."

WESLEY HAD SERIOUS DOUBTS ABOUT HIS FAITH.

Questioning one's faith should not be disparaged. Doubts are essential to making any belief system one's own. They do not mean that one will let it go. In fact, even as Wesley struggled with deep doubts about faith, he followed the wise instruction of a mentor who told him to "preach faith till you have it; and then, because you have it, you will preach faith." Even as we struggle, we can maintain our hold on the truths we question until we can settle all our doubts.

"METHODIST" WAS ORIGINALLY A DEROGATORY TERM.

Though the origins of the term "Methodist" are in dispute, it is clear that it was originally used by outsiders to mock John Wesley and his early societies because of their dedication to following a method for growing closer to God. They ended up accepting the term, considering it a positive descriptor of their movement. Way to own it, Methodists!

The days when caregivers/facilities automatically called the church no longer exist. The importance of letting your pastor know what's happening is

letting your pastor know what's happening is completely up to you.

Please know your pastor is very willing to be with you whenever you need her — if she knows!
