



#### Greetings!

By the time you receive this, Mary, Bryce, and I will already be back from three days at the MN Annual Conference in the Cities. It is the first time it has been in the Cities since I have been a pastor. I began going in the year 1999 and stayed in dorms at the St. Cloud University. It moved to the Civic Center a couple of years later, but I always missed the University. It was a more comfortable atmosphere...and it was warmer...which was sometimes good and sometimes not so good!

This year we will have times of discussion of the decisions made at the General Conference and move to putting them in place in our Conference. I don't anticipate a great deal of changes as the biggest decision was to remove discriminating language, not to directly change what we have been doing. One thing the LLPS know is that we can choose our own chair as in the past it was up to the Bishop to appoint our chair. Other legislation we proposed did not successfully make it to the floor for voting. We will continue to submit legislation for our concerns.

It was over a year ago when our church entered discussions about what was happening in the Conference and the legislation offered in the meeting of 2019 allowing churches to disaffiliate "due to conflict of (conscience) in human sexuality." We offered many opportunities over weeks to learn about the issues, offering videos, sharing information to help that process, we offered discussion groups, and named people who were willing to meet with you, all of it to help us make an informed and well thought out decision.

It was an emotional time, though it also offered the ability to dispel some misinformation that was being shared, it also offered us to learn more about <u>us</u> as a faith family. This time went well, and we learned that we were and are happy with where we are, that we have come along way as a faith family and the warmth and fellowship we share is meaningful and important in today's idea of church! We have a deep concern for those in our pews, we have deepened our care for each other, and we enjoy each other more and more, we are building relationships! God has and continues to bless us.

We took a straw poll and discussed how that turned out and we chose US! We chose to keep nurturing the heart of this faith family. We chose to love each other and accept each other and to continue to spread the gospel of Jesus, which is all about living as his example in a hurting world. We are happy with what we have and are becoming. Jesus lives among us, and it is important that we not lose this.

What's important for us to remember from this General Conference, is that the heart of our faith is still intact. We will not be forced to make decisions we are not comfortable making, and the heart of Methodism, which is a "deep, unshakeable love for everyone is still at the top." And that really describes what we do in our faith family! It is our mission!

This has been a constant discussion for many years. Now a decision has been made and we can move on to what is at the heart of what we do.....It was an emotional and difficult time, but it is hoped we will all take time to digest and ponder what it all really means for us. And remember, your pastor is always available to talk, some of you have reached out already, and I encourage you to continue to do so.

Thank you for being a wonderful group of Luverne United Methodists! And thank you for loving your church!
